

Bakau



Bakau is a little town on the Atlantic coast of Gambia, west of Gambias capital city of Banjul. It is the first major suburb outside Banjul and the most developed town in the Gambia. It is known for its botanical garden, its crocodile pool Kachikally, *the handicraft-market*, and for the beach at Cape Point. Close to Bakau and Banjul is Gambia's largest city, Serekunda.

There are no mosquito-nets, if you do not want mosquitos inside, you are advised to keep windows and doors closed.
